Introduction: The Bible, God’s Holy Word, is the most important book ever written. It is the only book that is inspired by God and without error. The Bible teaches us how we ought to live, corrects us when we need it, and trains us in righteousness (2 Timothy 3:16). Cadets know that Jesus said we will keep His commandments if we love Him. That means we have to know what His commandments are. To find out, we need to know the Bible.

Cadets have a Bible Knowledge merit badge to focus on what the Bible is, why it was written, how it was written, and its structure. We have a Bible Exploration merit badge to focus on using tools to explore the Bible, such as a commentary, Bible atlas, and concordance.

The Bible Study merit badge focuses on a single book from the Bible and studies it in more depth. The tool that you will need to earn this badge is a good study Bible.

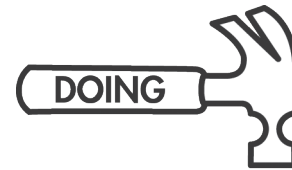
