- 1 Mike & Leonie VanderMeer** • Mike is the president of the Calvinist Cadet Corps and chairs the 2008 International Camporee steering committee.
- 2 Dick & Mary Broene** • Dick is the executive director of the Corps and editor of *Cadet Quest*. Mary is CCC secretary.
- 3 Bob & Manette deJonge** • Bob is the CCC art director, programming assistant, photographer, and webmaster.
- 4 Jack & Kathy Door** • Kathy is the executive secretary of the CCC; her husband Jack is a Cadet head counselor.
- 5 Titus & Kim Keller** • Kim is a part time secretary for the CCC, and mom to two little girls. (Kim's dream as a young girl was to be a Cadet.)
- 6 Ron & Sandy Noorman** • Pastor Ron serves as Cadet chaplain, which also involves him as chaplain at international camporees.
- 7 Bert & LaVonne Bakhuyzen** • Bert represents the CCC as club consultant to the independent clubs throughout North America.
- 8 Bernard & Anita Teeninga** • Bernard is the training coordinator, working with regional training coordinators and instructing trainees in the Developer of Counselor Education (DCE) program.
- 9 Del & Jane VanDenBerg** • Del serves as regional training coordinator (RTC) to the North Region: clubs in Alberta, Montana, and Colorado.
- 10 Marlin & Linda Hendricks** • Marlin is the RTC for the Northwest Region, which includes clubs in British Columbia and Washington.
- 11 Dale & Delores Frump** • Dale is the Midwest RTC, with clubs in Indiana, Illinois, Iowa, Wisconsin, Minnesota, Missouri, western Ontario, and South Dakota.
- 12 Lee Dobbs** • Lee is the RTC to the North Central region, serving clubs in the northern portions of Michigan.
- 13 Terry & Mary Kimber** • Terry is RTC for the South Central region. It includes clubs in southern Michigan, Indiana, and Florida.
- 14 Peter & Diane Tiemersma** • Peter is RTC for the Southwest region. Clubs are in California.
- 15 Clarence & Tina Dykhouse** • As the RTC for the East Central region, Clarence helps clubs in southwest Ontario.
- 16 Bill & Nancy Pennings** • As the RTC for the Eastern region, Bill works with clubs from eastern Ontario, New York, and New Jersey.
- 17 Developers of Counselor Education** • More than 100 DCEs have been trained to equip counselors in their respective areas. These men go through a rigorous training program, and are taught to assess needs, and develop and lead workshops.
- 18 Congressmen** • Congressmen take on extra duty, representing the CCC to their local clubs and their local clubs to the CCC through communication and decision making.
- 19 Quartermasters** • The quartermasters' job is to stay up to date on all the products that cadeting offers to enhance the ministry, and to keep their respective councils informed of what's available.
- 20 The 2008 International Camporee** • The most significant single event in the CCC is the international camporee, which occurs once every three years. Please pray that the 2008 camporee — scheduled to take place near Burk's Falls, Ontario — will positively affect the minds and hearts of all who attend. Pray for God's blessings on the host and steering committees as they plan the event over the coming years.
- 21 Dynamic Youth Ministries (DYM)** • Cadeting does not stand alone. Please pray for GEMS Girls' Clubs and Youth Unlimited, who together with the CCC make up the three ministries of DYM.
- 22 DYM Vision for Families** • DYM is currently making plans to bring a fourth ministry into being. That ministry is to meet the needs brought on by deteriorating families. Please pray that the visioning team will catch God's plan for how to reach these busy families and effectively minister to them for Him.
- 23 The International Convention** • Conventions bring counselors and their families together for inspiration, education, and fellowship. Please pray for the group planning the convention in Canmore, Alberta (2006), and for the group of councils beginning their work on the 2007 convention.
- 24 Executive Committee** • These nine men take on the duty of monitoring operations and making decisions between the annual board meetings (Congress).
- 25 Counselors** • Please pray for head counselors, who accept responsibility for running the Cadet clubs in their churches. Pray also for cadre counselors, who are on the front lines of building relationships with boys. Pray that they will succeed in helping the Cadets grow in all areas of life.
- 26 Individual Cadets** • Please pray that each boy becomes more conformed to the image of Christ as the season progresses.
- 27 Wives of Counselors** • It's not only counselors who "sacrifice" for cadeting. Please pray for the wives, who are willing to let the ministry grow at the expense of some family time.
- 28 Foreign Outreach** • The Cadet Corps has long ministered to children of missionaries on an individual basis. With the growth of the Internet, we have answered the call to serve larger groups as well, such as a club of 150 Cadets in the Ivory Coast. We are now exploring an opportunity to work with the Reformed Church of East Africa, possibly starting a large number of Cadet clubs in Kenya. Please pray for God's guidance in these areas.
- 29 Finances** • The ministry of cadeting costs more than churches give in offerings and pay for supplies. Cadets is not supported financially by any denomination. Please pray that God will provide for all our financial needs.
- 30 Congress** • Congress is the board of directors of the CCC, made up of men from all over North America. Their next annual meeting is January 4–6, 2007. Please pray for vision, wisdom and unity in the decision making process.
- 31 New (First Year) Counselors** • Please pray for new counselors, that they will grasp the importance of their calling and respond to God and the boys in a positive way.
