

Silver Star Award Guidelines



For: Jr. Counselors
Awarded at the council level

General Requirements

1. Junior counselors should not be encouraged to work for the Silver Star award, but rather this award should have an incentive aim: that the recipient will be motivated to a fuller and more enthusiastic participation in cadeting and will become an example to other junior counselors.
 2. Nominees for this award must have been an active junior counselor for a minimum of one Cadet season.
 3. Nominees for this award must have a good understanding of the Cadet program and the guidelines for junior counselor.
 4. Nominees must exhibit leadership potential.
 5. In order for a junior counselor to qualify for this award, an outstanding effort is required in one or more of the areas listed in the guidelines — or a superior accomplishment in a significant area not listed.
3. Outstanding achievement in one or more of the following areas ...
 - a. providing a Christian leadership example to Cadets and other junior counselors in his club and council.
 - b. successfully acting in place of a counselor for a significant period of time.
 - c. teaching Cadet skills to Cadets in his club or council.
 - d. planning, organizing, and/or conducting special activities at the council level.
 - e. assisting in the organization of new clubs.
 - f. contributing significantly to council or Corps publications.
 4. Nominations are to be made to the council president or congressman. Awards are to be made by the council board at an official council meeting or event of the Cadet season. We recommend that the award be given at a special event with his parents present, if possible.

Guidelines

1. Meets all the general requirements established for the Silver Star Award.
2. Displays enthusiasm for the Cadet program at the club and council level and takes part in club and council events whenever possible.
